## General garbage

### Designated bags for general garbage

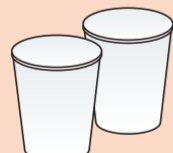
### Kitchen garbage

Be sure to drain liquid from food scraps beforehand.



### Wastepaper

Tissue, paper cups, synthetic paper, thermal paper, etc.  
For disposable diapers, flush wastes down the toilet beforehand.



### Cut branches / Grass / leaves

- Be sure to put them in the designated bags.
- Remove soil from the roots. (Up to 3 bags at a time)



## Recyclable garbage (It will be collected every two weeks.)

(Schedule is different between Group A and Group B.)

### Group A

Newspapers  
Inserts



Bind them with strings.

### Group B

Magazines  
Paper



Books, notebooks, catalogs (Remove plastic bags, covers, etc.)  
Paper, confectionery boxes  
Bind them with strings.

### Group C

#### Bottles

##### Designated bags for bottles

- Food bottles ● Drink bottles
- \* Empty out the bottles and rinse them with water. Remove the covers and caps. Put out metallic ones as recyclable garbage and plastic ones as landfill garbage.

#### Cans

##### Designated bags for cans

- Drink cans and food cans
- \* Empty out the cans and rinse them with water.

#### Spray cans

##### Plastic bags, etc.

- Spray cans
- Cassette cylinders
- \* Use up the contents, you must not open a hole in a can.

#### Metal items

##### Plastic bags, etc.

- Umbrellas ● Pots ● Kettles
- Frying pans ● Paint cans
- Electric cords

#### Clothes

##### Plastic bags, etc.

- Clothing, etc.

#### Milk cartons

Paper cartons of 500ml or more each



Wash. Unfold and dry.

#### Cardboard boxes

Unfold them flat and bind them criss cross with strings.

## Landfill garbage

### 1 Designated bags for landfill garbage

#### Plastics

- Styrofoam trays (If possible, put them in disposable tray bins at local supermarkets.)
- Food packages, styrofoam, bottles for shampoo, etc., plastic bags
- Food containers (for mayonnaise, ketchup, puddings, pot noodles, etc.), toys, confectionery bags, detergent containers, etc., stationery (e.g., ballpoint pens, tape cutters, rulers)

#### Leathers

- Shoes, bags, etc.

#### Synthetic rubber products and others

- Hoses, cords (Cut to 1 m or less.)
- Boots, etc.

### 2 Plastic bags

#### Fluorescent tubes/lighters

- Fluorescent tubes
- Disposable lighter
- Electric bulbs

### 3 Plastic bags

#### Others

- Heat-resistant glasses
- Broken glasses
- Ceramics (e.g., tea cups, plates)
- Cosmetic bottles

## Bulky garbage (Items larger than the designated bags)

Please do not put out garbage entering the specified bag!

- \* Put out plastic items in the designated bags as landfill garbage.
- \* Metallic items in the plastic bags, etc. as recyclable garbage.
- \* If possible, ask the retailers from where you purchased the items to collect them.

### Furniture, etc.

Wooden desks, beds, wardrobes, chairs, mirror stands

### Bedding

Futon, rugs, carpets, etc.

### Others

Bicycle, long item that cannot be disassembled, automotive batteries (excluding small batteries such as motorcycles and bicycles), etc.

### Electrical waste, small household electrical appliances

Battery- or electrically-operated, used electric appliances of any size  
\* Those subject to Home Appliance Recycling Act and those difficult for treatment are not collected. For their disposal, ask a store qualified for home appliance recycling or the store where you bought the appliance.

### Dry batteries

Dry-cell batteries, mercury thermometers, rechargeable battery etc.  
Put them in the designated container available at the designated collection place on the designated date for oversized trash.

### Waste cooking oil

Pour it in a transparent plastic bottle, and put it in the designated container available at the collection place.  
(Do not put out oil other than waste cooking oil.)

Do not put out garbage other than oversized trash.

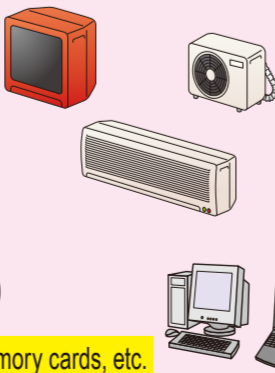
## Garbage that is not collected

Below-listed garbage under the Electric Appliance Recycling Law  
Ask the retailer or authorized dealer of home appliances for disposal.

- TVs (CRT TV, LCD TV, PDP TV)
- Refrigerators ● Freezers ● Clothes driers ● Washing machines ● Air conditioners

The following items are accepted for disposal only at the town office or Clean Center:

- Desktop PC bodies ● Cellular phones ● Notebook computers ● Personal information terminals, memory cards, etc.



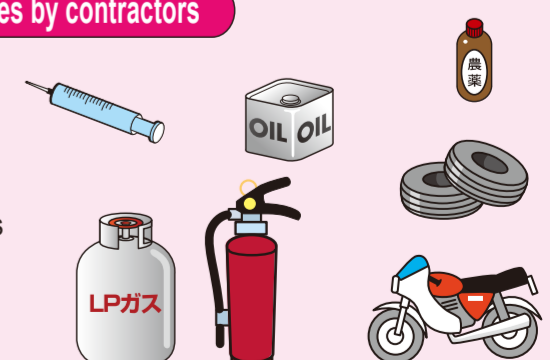
## Waste generated by new construction, extension, renovation and demolition of houses by contractors

- Building waste ● Bathtubs ● Sinks ● Washstands ● Tatami Mat ● Kawara Tile
- Concrete ● Block, etc.

## Indisposable garbage

- Fire extinguishers ● Waste oil ● Tiers ● Motorbikes ● Scooters ● Propane gas cylinders
- Syringes ● Syringe needles ● Agrichemicals ● Piano ● Agricultural plastic sheets
- Agricultural instruments ● Freon-containing / used product set.

(Ask the construction firm or retailers from where you purchased the items for disposal.)
